December is almost here and we are so happy to celebrate the holidays with all of you! I can't believe how quickly this year is flying by! I hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving with your children and family. In November we did so much! We read books about all kinds of forest /wildlife animals, *A Little Squirrel* by Rosalee, *Owl Babies,* and many more. We went on nature walks to find the prettiest Fall leaves to look at and used a sense of touch to feel the texture. We did lots of painting animal prints and turkey hands. Children were working on their fine motor

This month the children explored and created with technology. We explored gears through the use of wind-up toys and gear boards. On the gear boards, the children were able to see how the gears touch each other to create movement. Then we used the wind-up toys to show how they could work. Next, we explored the concept of expanding and contracting as well as big and small with the popping tubes. The children learned how to stretch the tubes longer and squish them smaller again. Along with the popping tubes, the children explored magnets. They created structures, stuck them on the magnet wall and experimented with what they would stick to in the classroom. The last technology we explored was ramps. We rolled cars and balls down the slide. In addition to technology, the children explored colors. We sorted colors, sang songs about colors, and practiced naming colors. With the weather getting colder, please check your child's cubby for season appropriate clothing as well as winter outside clothing: boots, coat, hat, mittens, and snowpants.
