

Busy Town, Infants

Happy New Year to all! May 2025 bring many good things to you and your family. Welcome to all our new families! Please know that we are here to help in any way we can. Please ask if you have any questions, concerns, or just want to know. In the month of December, we focused on math concepts, math talk, and having toys available for the babies to explore that built on these concepts. We played with blocks and balls of different types and sizes to compare big and small. A ring tower with each ring being a different color and texture to create patterns and recognize differences. When we sing songs related to our lesson theme with numbers, we are covering number order and correspondence.

We can make the math that occurs in daily life visible to children through math talk. Each day offers us countless opportunities to help children deepen their understanding of math concepts. The more we talk "math", the better chance infants and toddlers have to build a positive attitude toward math learning and learning in general.

Here a three examples of math concepts that we cover daily through our lesson plans:

1. Number and operations—understanding the concept of number, quantity, order,

Magical Moons, 2's

Hello Families- we hope you all had a wonderful and safe holiday. We had a fun and exciting December. The children were busy with various activities. In our art experiences, we painted with cabbage, potatoes, hands, marbles, and shapes. The children enjoyed making the cabbage and potatoes as a group project. They also enjoyed making their holiday gifts for you, we hope you like them. The children can't get enough of our science projects. They get so excited to see the balloon blow up when vinegar and baking soda mix. We also enjoyed a new one this month. We mixed Alka seltzer tablets with 7-Up. When these two were mixed, it made the Craisins we added bounce up and down. We called them dancing Craisins. During the day, we have carpet time, which the children seem to also enjoy. They get into a routine of doing this before morning snack and lunch. This way we can setup for both meals while the children are listening to stories. They know some of these songs, flannels, and stories by heart. You may hear them sing it at home, we apologize if they sing them a lot. They do have their favorites. When we dance, we do it well. We boogie down to the Chicken Dance, Hokey Pokey, and Freeze Dance. The children also like going on a Bear Hunt and the Goldfish song. If

ways of representing numbers, one-to-one correspondence (that one object corresponds to one number), and counting. *Counting while singing a song. *Counting while handing out snack. *Counting while building a block tower. 2. Shapes and spatial relationships (geometry)—recognizing and naming shapes, understanding the physical relationship between yourself and other objects and the relationships between objects.

*Talking during snack and labeling the shape of the crackers.

*Stacking blocks together by size (big on the bottom, small on the top) and knocking them down.

3. Patterns, relationships, and change recognizing (seeing the relationships that make up a pattern) and/or creating repetitions of objects, events, colors, lines, textures, and sounds; understanding that things change over time and that change can be described with math words.

*Taking notice of who is wearing stripes on their clothes that day.

*Connecting words with actions: I put the blocks in the bucket and you dumped them out. Let's do it again."

Math talk enriches everyday learning experiences for infants and toddlers. You'll be surprised at how much they know and can learn. Your math talk today can help your children be successful in math in the future.
