We still need to pay staff even if a child does not attend when they are supposed to. **How do I ask for a vacation day?* The best way is through our website, Vacation Request. The requests are sent right to me and Sheryl, who tracks vacation days and credits tuition in accordance with our vacation policy.

**Can you please keep my child inside; they have a cold...* If your child cannot go outside, then they are too ill to be here. Fresh air does not cause illness.

For school age families, please notify us if we are not picking up your child from school. This has been happening with more frequency and it is a safety issue if a teacher has to run to the office to check or we have to call multiple numbers to find out where a child is. The app is a great way to let us know or at drop off! Thank you for helping us. Hope some of this helps!

Magical Moons, 2's

"February, the month of love, is a time to cherish the bonds that warm our hearts." With this on our minds, and babies just starting day care a short time ago, Mo and I are focusing on making connections with our babies knowing how essential this is for all. An infant's social and emotional development is crucial because it lays the groundwork for future relationships, self-esteem, emotional regulation, and the ability to interact with others. Our child evaluation and portfolio have a focus on a child's social and emotional growth. In our daily routine, we take time to talk to each baby one on one, sing songs together, and recognize their needs by their differential cries. By making Hello families! We can't believe it is February already. We have kept the children busy with multiple activities. We learned about transportation, which brought us to decorate stoplight cookies, race cars, and trucks around the room and speed around on the scooters. Watch out, you might get run over! Our friends tend not to look both ways before crossing the room. We also painted with sponges in the shape of circles and squares and Bingo Dabbers. After Transportation, we explored the Arctic. We painted with Arctic animal feet, glued cotton balls to paper, and painted with Q-tips. The children don't seem to mind what they are painting with, as long as they can get

this connection, children feel connected to their caregivers and want to cooperate and learn from us. Being a parent and caregiver is the toughest job we have! And time is not always on our side. Here are 3 ideas to add connections with your child that could leave a lasting impression.

*Play with each other and laugh together. It is important to take the time to have fun with each other.

*Turn off technology when you are together. It is so easy to have our phone in our hand or check our e-mail one more time. However, it is very important to focus on the people we are with and let them know they are important. *Slow down and savor the moment together. Every interaction all day long is an opportunity to connect. Spend a few minutes before bed. make mealtime a time for the family to connect at the end of the day, talk about your child's day before they rush off to school in the morning.
