
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Growing Highlights MARCH 2025

Reading books, singing songs, and telling stories are some of our classroom's favorite activities. Some of their favorite stories are *Peek a Boo Moo*. The Wheels on the Bus, Big Bug Little Bug and many more. This is a great way to provide a language rich environment, but language development is a two-way process. The amount of verbal interaction with your child is as important as the amount of language you use. As a parent, you can encourage the development of language skills with your child by interacting regularly, singing songs, and reading simple stories. As your child grows, they can talk about their day or explain their likes and dislikes. You can also play games with your child, such as naming objects or practicing concepts of direction; for example: in, out, over, and through. In addition to reading stories, the children also enjoyed exploring dramatic play. They rocked, swaddled, and carried baby dolls all around the room and pretended to be chefs by cooking with play food and utensils. One of the themes this month was construction and transportation. The children were able to pretend to be construction workers. They pounded golf tees into Styrofoam, built buildings with magnet blocks, and read stories about different types of vehicles. Love You". In March, we will continue to spend more time on the floor engaging in different activities like visual patterns and high contrast visual stimuli. March's theme is Growing and Blooming and Farm. We will read new books such as *Hello Bugs* What Do You Do? By Loes Batman, The *Tiny Seed* by Eric Carle, *Backyard Bugs* Touch and Feel sensory book, and more, sing new songs, like Rain, Rain, Go Away, Flannel stories: "Five Little Ladybugs" and "Five Littles Bunnies". Also, we will have different sensory projects. We will continue to practice gentle hugs with soft dolls, encouraging children to reach and grasp sensory toys. We will also Play Pat a Cake with hand movements. We hope it will start to get warmer outside, and we will take the children on a walk.
