Just a reminder, you are more than welcome to come into the classroom and read as much as you would like. This month we explored Dr Seuss and read many of his stories. We read -The Foot Book, The Nose Book, and many more. We expanded on his books by talking about body parts, numbers and letters. In addition to Dr. Seuss, we let our creative side shine this month. The children painted with balloons to create abstract pictures. We created designs with glue and glitter to make designs that sparkled. Along with using these mediums, we experimented with watercolors. In addition to exploring our creative side, we explored technology. We explored gears with the use of wind-up toys and gear boards as we learned about magnetism

Observing & Discovering: Exploring garden bugs, introducing new toys, and reading The Tiny Seed, Planting a Rainbow, and Hello Bugs, What Do You Do?

Creative Arts. Painting ladybugs, using blue for raindrops, and making Springinspired crafts. Songs & Movement: Singing "Rain, Rain, Go Away", dancing with puppets, and playing movement games like "Spring Jumping." Sensory & Hands-On Play. Using a sensory bin with soft petals, water play with small animals, and creating backyard bug sensory boards. We will be entering farm life in the middle of this month:) with a journey to the farm! Children will learn about different farm animals, their sounds, and how they help us. Seeing & Exploring. Looking at farm animal pictures, sorting toy animals, and setting up a pretend farm. Hearing & Singing: Listening to animal sounds, singing "Old MacDonald Had a Farm", and reading Big Red Barn. Touching & Creating: Feeling textures like wool and feathers, playing with farm animal puppets, and making handprint chickens. Arts & Crafts: Sponge painting farm animals and using cotton balls for fluffy sheep crafts.

Social & Math Skills: Practice turn-taking with farm toys, learning animal sign

with magnetic wands and paper clips. We even raced cars down ramps.
