## Pigeons - 4K

April was an exciting time for the 4K class. We learned about Music and our caterpillars arrived!

During the Music unit, we were introduced to many different musical genres and instruments. We practiced playing the keyboard and many percussion instruments. A middle school music teacher (also a parent) shared her talent with 5 different instruments. We listened to how music can make us feel different emotions and we listened to how music can help tell a story. We categorized different types of instruments and how some are high in pitch and some are low. With this first glimpse of music, I hope each student gets excited to learn an instrument in their future.

Something to try at home, at any age: point out different instruments you hear while listening to music in the car. Share with them how music makes you feel.

We are talking more about bugs in the next two weeks but our caterpillars arrived early so we are watching them as they grow and transform. We documented what we were seeing and measured their growth. They start off as small as 1cm and grow up to 4cm in just 2 weeks. Stay tuned to the 4K classroom for more exciting bug or insect lessons coming in May.
