

#### Infants

It looks like Spring is finally trying to make its way into Wisconsin! So, with the warmer weather comes more time outside and going for walks. Now is the time to check your child's cubby to replace cold weather clothing with warmer weather clothing. This month's lesson plan themes were "friends" and "nursery rhymes". For literacy, we read "Hello World", "Best Friends Sleep Over", and "Gossie and Gertie". We enjoyed flannel board stories such as "Row, Row, Row Your Boat", "The Wheels on the Bus", and "Goldilocks and the Three Bears". For art exploration, we did silhouette sponge painting with a "muffin man" sponge and fold art with different colored paints. Some of our goals were: give an object to an adult upon request and walking movement with assistance. Helping infants with walking movements is crucial for developing fundamental motor skills, fostering cognitive and social development, and promoting overall well-being. This month the children had a great time learning and exploring. Our first theme center was around Sesame Street, where the children practiced identifying colors and honed their predicting skills by playing hide and seek with character cards. They also tapped into their creativity by creating their own stories using flannel board pieces. Alongside the Sesame Street unit, the children delved into learning about the farm. We sang about Old MacDonald's farm and sorted animals by colors. Next, we played hide and seek with a cow hiding behind different colored barns. In addition to all the fun learning, the children enjoyed the Week of the Young Child Activities. On Monday, the children had fun exploring music. We danced, played the drums, and sang songs. Tuesday followed with an awesome French Toast party. The children loved creating their own yummy treat. On Wednesday, we came together as a community and planted. The class created a terrarium out of a large soda bottle. Then we planted bean seeds. We will keep you updated on whether they grow. To enhance the concept of planting, we made and ate dirt cups that afternoon. Thursday, we became artists and painted on a giant canvas with paint, shaving cream, bubble wrap, and a scraper. Friday, families were able to take

the flannel board, *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See* by Eric Carle, *Five Green & Speckled Frogs*, and *What Color Do You See* (crayons colors) and more. We had so much fun playing different learning games like Farmers Market color sorting, shape sorter, and color stacker. We used touch and feel books, so children can learn different textures. Water sensory bins to play, listen to songs about colors, farms, and frogs. We created art projects using different tools and different colors of paint.

Also, we learned sign language for "cow", "pig", "color", "water", "hop", and more. May will be a busy month. Our themes of the month are Nature in Spring and Ocean. We will read more new books and flannel stories, like *Let's Go Outside* by Ekaterina Trukhan, *Everything Grows* by Raffi, *Way* Down Deep in the Deep Blue Sea, Baby Beluga, and more. We will play animal matching games, sensory bins with soft natural materials, listen to bird sounds and frog sounds, listen to ocean waves, and more. We will look at the different patterns as well as the paintings of the nature painter, April Gornik. We hope to enjoy the Spring days and take many walks outside. Children will continue to develop gross motor and small motor skills during this month. As Mother Day soon approaches, we will work on a special Mother's Day project.
